## **Mission Statements**

<u>College</u>: The College of Science and Health Professions provides in-depth education for students who select majors and minors in the college and general education courses for those who select majors in other colleges.

<u>Department</u>: The mission of the Department of Health Professions is to provide specialized education designed to prepare students whose career goals encompass the fields represented by the professional health programs within the Department.

<u>Program</u>: The mission of the Northeastern State University Speech- Language Pathology Program is two-fold: 1) to provide pre-professional undergraduate education leading to a Bachelor of Science degree as a prerequisite for admission to a graduate degree program in communication disorders and 2) to provide graduate education leading to a Master of Science degree with the academic and clinical practicum experience necessary to meet requirements for the Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, the license in speech-language pathology from Oklahoma Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, and the Oklahoma State Department of Education Standard Certificate in Speech-Language Pathology.

- Outcome #2: Faculty within the SLP Program will exhibit and improve teaching skills.
  Action Steps:
  - a. Faculty will obtain a minimum average of 10 continuing education hours per year to be

assessed over a 2-year period for OBESPA requirements and over a 3-year period for ASHA requirements. Faculty will complete ethics training every 3 years in accordance with ASHA standards and any new continuing education requirements. Faculty members that supervise clinical practicum opportunities will complete required supervision continuing education.

- b. Faculty will score at least an average of 3 or above on student course assessments (on a scale of 1-5)
- c. Faculty members will achieve the goals set through their development plans implemented by the Department.

Performance Measure(s): Continuing Education Units will be registered with the ASHA CEU Registry or will provide certificates of completion for continuing education requirements, Score of at least an average of

3 or above on student course assessments

Time Frame: Semester, FDP's each year

*Point Person:* SLP faculty members and program chair *Assessment Methods:* ASHA CEU Registry or documentation of continuing education, CTL online course assessments, observations, review of development plans

Budget Needs: Flexibility for faculty to attend education programs, conferences, workshops, \$2000-3000 per year per faculty member (\$10,000-15,000)

 Outcome #3: Graduate students will meet all academic and clinical practicum experience requirements for the Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology from the American

Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA CCC-SLP), the license in speech-language pathology from Oklahoma Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology (OBESPA License in

Speech-Language Pathology), and the Oklahoma State Department of Education Standard Certificate in Speech-Language Pathology (OSDE SLP Standard Certificate).

**Action Steps:** 

- a. Graduate Students will complete the required clinical practicum for the ASHA CCC-SLP, the OBESPA License in Speech-Language Pathology, and the OSDE SLP Standard Certificate.
- b. Graduate Students will meet the academic standards for the ASHA CCC-SLP, the OBESPA License in Speech-Language Pathology, and the

OSDE SLP Standard Certificate.
